



TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH

**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(RUDDINGTON FOOTPATH NO.5)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2024**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an ORDER, under Sections 14 and 15(8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be:

To continue the effects of THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (**RUDDINGTON FOOTPATH NO.5**) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) NOTICE **2024**.

That Notice came into force on 1st August 2024.

The effects are that:-

No person shall: - proceed on foot,

in the following length of Footpath at Ruddington in the Borough of Rushcliffe-

Ruddington Footpath No.5, from its junction with Ruddington Footpath No.4 immediately to the west of the railway crossing footbridge, to where Ruddington Footpath No.5 ends at Ruddington Footpath No.6, Asher Lane.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction the alternative route available for pedestrians will be as follows: -

Asher Lane (Footpath No.6), Musters Road, Distillery Street and Footpath No.14 and No.5, and vice versa

IT IS INTENDED that the prohibition respecting the above highway or highways will apply as follows:-

To 31st January 2025 inclusive.

The Continuation Order will come into force on 22nd August 2024 and any prohibition contained in the continued Order shall apply on that day and on any subsequent day or days when it shall be necessary for the prohibition to apply to enable works to be carried out and the Order shall continue in full force until the works it is proposed to carry out are completed The duration of this Order may be extended with the approval of the relevant Secretary of State.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety until essential repair and maintenance work can be completed to a timber footbridge crossing the brook.
