

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (UPPER BROUGHTON FOOTPATH NO.6) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an ORDER, under Sections 14 and 15(8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be:

To continue the effects of THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (<u>UPPER BROUGHTON FOOTPATH NO.6</u>) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) NOTICE <u>2025</u>.

That Notice came into force on 12th March 2025.

The effects are that:-

No person shall: -

(a) proceed on foot,

in the following length of Footpath at Upper Broughton in the Borough of Rushcliffe:

<u>Upper Broughton Footpath No.6</u>, from the first footbridge when heading south from Kinoulton, south of Willow Farm, to the field south of the second footbridge.

<u>AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN</u> that during the period of restriction the alternative route available for pedestrians to Old Dalby will be via Upper Broughton Footpath No.7.

<u>IT IS INTENDED</u> that the prohibition respecting the above highway or highways will apply as follows:-

To 11th September 2025 inclusive.

The Continuation Order will come into force on 2nd April 2025 and any prohibition contained in the continued Order shall apply on that day and on any subsequent day or days when it shall be necessary for the prohibition to apply to enable works to be carried out and the Order shall continue in full force until the works it is proposed to carry out are completed The duration of this Order may be extended with the approval of the relevant Secretary of State.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety due to damaged footbridge on route and to enable repair or replacement.
