

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF BRIDLEWAY**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BURTON JOYCE BRIDLEWAY NO.1 AND BULCOTE BRIDLEWAY NO.3)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION NO.2 ORDER 2025**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sections 14 and 15 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 approves of The Nottinghamshire County Council (BURTON JOYCE BRIDLEWAY NO.1 AND BULCOTE BRIDLEWAY NO.3) (Temporary Prohibition) Notice 2024 (which came into force on 18th July 2024 and was continued by a Continuation Order which remains in force until 17th January 2025 inclusive) being extended and continuing in force until 17th January 2026 or until completion of the relevant works, whichever is the sooner.

The Order has the following effect:-

No person shall: -

- (a) proceed on foot,
- (b) cause any pedal cycle to proceed,
- (c) cause any horse to proceed,
- (d) cause any animal to proceed,

in the following length of Bridleway at Burton Joyce in the Borough of Gedling, and Bulcote in the District of Newark and Sherwood:

Burton Joyce Bridleway No.1 continuing as Bulcote Bridleway No.3, from Willow Wong to the track near to Hill Farm, as shown on the accompanying plan.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction there is no direct alternative route available.

If the works are not completed within the above period the Order may be extended for a longer period with the further approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety due to serious surface damage to the Bridleway and to enable repairs to be carried out.
