



TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF FOOTPATH

**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(WILLOUGHBY-ON-THE-WOLDS FOOTPATH NO.1)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2025**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nottinghamshire County Council HAS MADE an ORDER, under Sections 14 and 15(8) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be:

To continue the effects of THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL **(WILLOUGHBY-ON-THE-WOLDS FOOTPATH NO.1)** (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) NOTICE **2025**.

That Notice came into force on 2nd April 2025.

The effects are that: -No person shall: -

(a) proceed on foot,

in the following length of Footpath at Willoughby-on-the-Wolds in the Borough of Rushcliffe:

Willoughby-on-the-Wolds Footpath No.1 from where the path starts at its junction with Thorpe-in-the-Glebe Footpath No.2 to the western side of the footbridge over Kingstone Brook SK 61833 26373, to where Willoughby-on-the-Wolds Footpath No.1 crosses the vehicular access track to Thorpe Plantation SK 62225 26079.

AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that during the period of restriction there is no direct alternative route on public rights of way.

IT IS INTENDED that the prohibition respecting the above highway or highways will apply as follows:-

To 1st October 2025 inclusive.

The Continuation Order will come into force on 23rd April 2025 and any prohibition contained in the continued Order shall apply on that day and on any subsequent day or days when it shall be necessary for the prohibition to apply to enable works to be carried out and the Order shall continue in full force until the works it is proposed to carry out are completed. The duration of this Order may be extended with the approval of the relevant Secretary of State.

The prohibition is required to protect public safety until essential repairs can be completed to two timber footbridges along this route.
