

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF BRIDLEWAY

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BINGHAM BRIDLEWAY NO.22) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION) CONTINUATION ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State Transport in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sections 14 and 15 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 approves of The Nottinghamshire County Council (Bingham Bridleway No.22) (Temporary Prohibition) Order 2024 (which came into force on 15th July 2024 and continues in force until 14th January 2025 inclusive) being extended and continuing in force until 14th January 2026 or until completion of the relevant works, whichever is the sooner.

The Order has the following effect:-

No person shall: -

- (a) proceed on foot,
- (b) cause any pedal cycle to proceed,
- (c) cause any horse to proceed,
- (d) cause any animal to proceed,

in the following length of Bridleway at Bingham in the Borough of Rushcliffe:-

Bingham Bridleway No.22 at its northern end alongside the site of Buggings Cottage.

<u>AND NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN</u> that during the period of restriction there is no direct alternative route available for pedestrians.

If the works are not completed within the above period the Order may be extended for a longer period with the further approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.

The prohibition is required to enable demolision and construction of new housing alongside the bridleway, and in respect of the likelihood of danger to the public and damage to the bridleway.
